**Next month Townsville, next year the world . . . . .**

In July, Chair-Secretary Ruth and Treasurer Dianne are off to the Australian Wildlife Rehabilitation Conference in Townsville where they'll be presenting papers. Ruth's paper is a case study on Turtle 17, the last turtle to be rescued from Blue Gum Lake in during the second stage rescue in 2011 , whilst Dianne's is titled *Oblong Turtles; Clobbered by Climate Change*. Meanwhile, membership secretary Karen is in Vietnam to work in a Wildlife Rescue Centre, followed by some volunteer work with *Free the Bears* in Cambodia.
